

A Occupancies

| Group | Division | Description |
|-------|----------|---|
| A | 1 | Occupancies are buildings or portions of buildings having an assembly room with an occupant load of 1,000 or more and a legitimate stage. |
| A | 2 | Occupancies are buildings or portions of buildings having an assembly room with an occupant load less than 1,000 and a legitimate stage. |
| A | 2.1 | Occupancies are buildings or portions of buildings having an assembly room with an occupant load of 300 or more without a legitimate stage. |
| A | 3 | Occupancies are buildings or portions of buildings having an assembly room with an occupant load of 300 or less without a legitimate stage. |
| A | 4 | Occupancies are stadiums, reviewing stands and amusement park structures not included within other Group A occupancies. |

B Occupancies

| Group | Description |
|-------|--|
| B | <p>Occupancies are buildings, structures, or portions thereof, for office, professional or service-type transactions. B occupancies include occupancies for the storage of records and accounts, and eating and drinking establishments with an occupant load of less than 50. Business occupancies shall include, in part:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Animal hospitals, automobile show rooms, banks, barber shops, car washes, laundry and dry cleaning pick-up/delivery stations, educational occupancies above the 12th grade, electronic data processing, fire stations, florists, testing and research laboratories, police stations, post offices, print shops, professional services (attorney, dentist, etc.), telephone exchanges.</p> |

E Occupancies

| Group | Division | Description |
|-------|----------|--|
| E | | Occupancies are buildings used for educational purposes the 12 th grade by 50 or more persons for more than 12 hours per week or four hours in any one day. |
| E | 2 | Occupancies are buildings used for educational purposes through the 12 th grade by less than 50 persons for more than 12 hours per week or four hours in any one day. |
| E | 3 | Occupancies are any non-residential building used for day care purposes for more than 6 persons. Any residential building used for day care purposes for more than 12 persons. |

H Occupancies

| Group | Division | Description |
|-------|----------|--|
| H | 1 | Occupancies are buildings or structures that involve manufacturing processing, generation or storage of materials in excess of those listed in CBC Table 3-D which present a high explosion hazard. |
| H | 2 | Occupancies are Buildings or structures where combustible dust is manufactured, used or generated in such concentrations that create a fire or explosion potential; occupancies with a quantity of material in excess of those listed in the CBC Table 3-D which represent a moderate explosion hazard or a hazard from accelerated burning. |
| H | 3 | Occupancies are buildings or structures where flammable solids, other than combustible dust, are manufactured, used or generated; buildings in which the quantity of material is in excess of those listed in CBC Table 3-D which present a high physical hazard. |
| H | 4 | occupancies are (vehicle) repair garages not classified as Group S, Division 3 occupancies. |
| H | 5 | occupancies are aircraft repair hangers not classified as Group S, Division 5 occupancies or heliports. |
| H | 6 | occupancies are semiconductor fabrication facilities and comparable research and development areas in which hazardous production materials are used where the aggregate quantity of materials is in excess of those listed in Table 8001.13-A or 8001.13-B. |
| H | 7 | occupancies are occupancies having quantities of materials in excess of those listed in Table 8001. 15-B that are health hazards, including corrosives, toxic and highly toxic material, irritants and sensitizers. |
| H | 8 | occupancies are laboratories and similar areas for scientific experimentation or research, but not classified as an H-1, H-2, H-3, H-6, H-7 or B occupancy. |

I Occupancies

| Group | Division | Description |
|-------|----------|--|
| I | 1.1 | Occupancies are hospitals, sanitariums and nursing homes with nonambulatory patients where medical care is provided, nurseries for the full-time care of children under the age of six (each accommodating more than six patients) |
| I | 1.2 | Occupancies are health-care centers for ambulatory patients receiving two outpatient medical care which may render the patient incapable of unassisted self-preservation (each tenant space accommodating more than five patients) |
| I | 2 | Occupancies are nursing homes for ambulatory patients where medical care is provided, homes for ambulatory children six years of age or over where medical aid is provided, honor farms and conservation camps housing six inmates who are restrained (each accommodating six or more patients). |
| I | 3 | occupancies are mental hospitals, mental sanitariums, jails, prisons, reformatories and buildings where personal liberties of inmates are similarly restrained. |

M Occupancies

| Group | Description |

| M | <p>Occupancies are buildings used for the display and sale of merchandise, and involving stock of goods, wares or merchandise incidental to such purposes and accessible to the public. Mercantile occupancies shall include, but are not limited to:</p> <p>Department stores, drug stores, markets, paint stores without bulk handling, shoppingcenters, sales rooms, wholesale and retail stores</p> |

R Occupancies

| Group | Division | Description |

| R | 1 | Occupancies are hotels, motels and apartment houses, congregate residences (each accommodating more than 10 persons). |
| R | 2.1 | Occupancies are residential care facilities (each accommodating more than 6 nonambulatory patients). |
| R | 2.1.1 | Occupancies are residential care facilities (each accommodating 6 or fewer nonambulatory patients). |
| R | 2.2 | Occupancies are residential care facilities (each accommodating more than 6 ambulatory patients). |
| R | 2.2.1 | Occupancies are residential care facilities (each accommodating 6 or fewer ambulatory patients). |
| R | 2.3 | Occupancies are residentially-based, licensed facilities providing hospice care throughout accommodating more than 6 bedridden clients. |
| R | 2.3.1 | Occupancies are residentially-based, licensed facilities providing hospice care throughout accommodating 6 or fewer bedridden clients. |
| R | 3 | Occupancies are dwellings and lodgings, congregate residences (each accommodating 10 persons or fewer). |
| R | 6.1 | Occupancies are residential group facilities which provide care and/or supervisory service with more than 6 nonambulatory residents. |
| R | 6.1A | Occupancies are residential group facilities which provide care and/or supervisory service with 6 or fewer nonambulatory residents. |
| R | 6.2 | Occupancies are residential group facilities which provide care and/or supervisory service with more than 6 ambulatory residents. |
| R | 6.2A | Occupancies are residential group facilities which provide care and/or supervisory service with 6 or fewer ambulatory residents. |
