1. First 5 LA Commission Funding Award for Mar Vista Apartments:

On July 12, 2012 the Los Angeles County Children and Families First Proposition 10 Commission – First 5 LA issued a one-time competitive Notice of Funding Availability for permanent supportive housing for homeless children and their families. On November 29, 2012 the First 5 LA Commission awarded capital funding to five developments in Los Angeles County including \$1.4 million to National Community Renaissance for the Mar Vista Apartments. According to William Huang, Director of Housing, the development will be located at the northwest corner of Mar Vista Avenue and Union Street in Pasadena and is anticipated to provide 20 new construction units for formerly homeless families. Social services will be provided by Union Station Homeless Services. This funding award is critically important as the project is at risk of losing some of its committed funding due to the dissolution of redevelopment.

2. Pasadena Water Department Turns 100:

On Thursday, December 6, Pasadena Water and Power (PWP) celebrated the 100th anniversary of the Pasadena Water Department with a special appreciation luncheon for all PWP employees, community partners and other special guests. According to Phyllis Currie, General Manager Water and Power the PWP's centennial celebration will continue into the New Year with the Armory Center for the Arts Exhibit and Public Engagement Program entitled "Facing the Sublime in Water, CA" that runs through January 20, 2013. 3. Arroyo Seco Foundation Award:

On Wednesday, December 12, Pasadena Water and Power (PWP) received one of nine 2012 Arroyo Verde Awards, presented at the Council of Arroyo Seco Organizations annual holiday celebration. The "Greening the Arroyo" award recognizes PWP's contribution to the Arroyo Seco Canyon project that received a \$3.2 million grant from Proposition 84 funds. According to Phyllis Currie, General Manager Water and Power design work and environmental documentation will commence next week, and the project is scheduled to be completed by December 2015. 4. PWP Electrical Crews Return from Storm Ravaged Long Island NY:

PWP crews sent to assist the Long Island Power Authority recover from Hurricane Sandy returned safely from New York in time to celebrate Thanksgiving with their families. According to Phyllis Currie, General Manager Water and Power, employees were inspired by their experience. PWP has expressed our gratitude to the City of Farmingdale, NY, for hosting our crews in between long shifts. PWP's Doug Schmaderer, Power Distribution Crew Supervisor, was assigned the responsibility to lead and coordinate the Southern California APPA utility crews from Pasadena, Anaheim, Burbank, and Riverside. 5. Pasadena Wins Southern California Flag Football Tournament:

The City of Pasadena hosted the Southern California Municipal Athletic Federation's (SCMAF) 2012 Flag Football Championship this past weekend, December 8th and 9th at Victory Park Center. Mercy Santoro, Director of Human Services and Recreation Department is proud to announce that over 500 people attended the event and witnessed Pasadena's team win the Tournament Championship on Sunday, December 9th.

Teams from Northern California to Orange County visited Pasadena to compete for the opportunity to be crowned the 2012 Southern California Municipal Athletic Federation Flag Football Champions. Pasadena last won a championship in 2004, when the team won its first 7th and 8th grade SCMAF Championship. Several of the players from that team went on to play High School Football and seven of the 11 players on that championship team received full scholarships to play football at major universities. The most notable player is Pasadena local Dietrich Riley who currently plays football for the UCLA Bruins.

Special guest Chelsea J, who was the 2012 Pasadena Idol winner, performed the National Anthem and the Pasadena High School color guard provided the ceremonial flag presentation. Special thanks to Victory Park, After-School Adventures Program staff, Arcadia Recreation staff, and numerous volunteers who helped to run the weekend tournament. Congratulations Pasadena!



Tree Removal List

The attached list highlights pending removals of dead, dying and hazardous trees on a non-emergency basis throughout Pasadena, as well as trees recently removed on an emergency basis. The Parks & Natural Resources Division has posted the non-emergency removals and notified pertinent residents consistent with the City's Tree Removal Policy.

Tree Plantings

Since the November 30/December 1, 2011 windstorm, the Parks & Natural Resources Division has been actively reforesting the City. In the last year, the Division has planted more than 1,850 trees throughout the City. Efforts included hosting three community tree planting events resulting in 325 volunteers planting 302 trees.

Trees planted during the community events, as well as the 375 trees planted by the Pasadena Beautiful Foundation and 1,173 trees planted by the Division's in-house and contract crews, were partially funded through donations from the Odwalla Plant-A-Tree program, Pasadena Beautiful Foundation, Pasadena Community Foundation, Schow Family Foundation, Kaiser Foundation and numerous individual donations.

The attached tree removal list includes several locations within the Lower Arroyo. In furtherance of the tree planting efforts, the Parks & Natural Resources Division will be replanting thirty-two sites in the Lower Arroyo on Monday, December 17.
