**WEEKLY NEWSLETTER**

1. **Update on Pasadena Humane Society's GPS System:**

The Pasadena Humane Society (PHS) installed the Chameleon GPS system in all seven of their patrol vehicles; however, the system is experiencing difficulties with intermittent transmission signal strength and other software issues. The City offered assistance from our Department of Information Technology to assist in addressing the problem and PHS accepted. The Chameleon group indicated that a temporary fix should be available by the end of this week and a permanent fix in about two to three weeks. The GPS portion of the system is currently operating at about 20 percent accuracy.

I have attached a memorandum from Andrew Green, Director of Finance that provides additional information on the GPS system and a sample of the PHS new GPS system report for February 2013.

2. **Final California Department of Finance Ruling on the Heritage Square (Southern Portion) and Howard & Navarro Housing Sites:**

In a favorable outcome since the dissolution redevelopment over a year ago, the Housing Department successfully contested a State determination regarding the southern portion of the Heritage Square redevelopment project site ("Heritage Square South").

In August 2012 the State Department of Finance ("DOF") originally disallowed the transfer of Heritage Square South from the City's Successor Agency to its Housing Successor on the grounds that the project site did not meet the definition of a Housing Asset. According to William K. Huang, Housing Director, the Department appealed in a Meet and Confer session on

February 13, 2013 which resulted in DOF reversing its original determination and rendering a final decision in the City's favor. The State also agreed with Housing's request that the property located at 136-138 W. Howard Street be classified as a Housing Asset.

Both properties were acquired by the City utilizing various funding sources that are restricted to affordable housing uses. The State's final determination removes these two project sites from the Successor Agency real property disposition process and clears the way for the City, as Housing Successor, to proceed with development plans to include affordable housing.

**3. Pasadena Police Calls for Service Report – February 2013:**

Attached is the Preliminary Monthly Statistical Report for the month of February 2013 from Phillip L. Sanchez, Chief of Police. This report is based on report calls for service rather than the uniform crime reporting (UCR) stats. The report reflects specific call types that resulted in a report/arrest disposition sorted by Service Area and Council District.

**4. One City, One Story – March 2013:**

To embellish the One City, One Story experience, Library and Information Services staff has planned a rich offering of programs and events. Book discussions (of course), ecology-centered sessions, recycling exercises, scientific presentations, and much more are all listed on the attached reference materials.

**5. Auditions for 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Pasadena Idol:**

Mercy Santoro, Director of Human Services and Recreation is pleased to announce the 7th Annual Summer Teen Singing Competition, Pasadena Idol. While the event is scheduled for August 24, 2013, auditions for the show are being held March 15 at the Donald R. Wright Auditorium at Central Library from 3:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Auditions are open to singers from the Pasadena area between the ages of 13 to 18. If necessary, more audition dates in March will be announced.

The top 10 singers from the pool of participants will be chosen to compete for the Pasadena Idol 2013 title on August 24. The 2013 Pasadena Idol Winner will receive the Idol Demo Pack, which includes studio time, two song demos and 100 CDs. Prizes will also be awarded to 2nd and 3rd place winners as well. Up to 60 youth will be chosen to participate in the Idol Essentials Workshops subsequent to the audition date(s) (attendance at the workshops is required for participants to compete in the finals). The workshops will be held this coming May, June and July.

This free event was created as a Youth Month activity and has grown since its first year at Victory Park. This is the third year it is being held at Paseo Colorado in the Garfield Promenade. Co-sponsors for this popular event include Paseo Colorado, and local companies *Dena Magazine*, S Claz Productions, Swartz Section, and Mike Towns Sounds.

**6. University of Southern California Service Day at Villa-Parke:**



**RE:** Update on Pasadena Humane Society's GPS System

The Pasadena Humane Society (PHS) installed the Chameleon GPS system in all seven of their patrol vehicles; however, the system is experiencing difficulties with intermittent transmission signal strength and other software issues. The City offered assistance from the City's DoIT department to assist in addressing the problem and PHS accepted. The Chameleon group indicated that a temporary fix should be available by the end of this week and a permanent fix in about two to three weeks. The GPS portion of the system is currently operating at about 20 percent accuracy. Consequently, PHS continues to maintain manual logs as a validation mechanism to the new system.

PHS provided a sample to City staff of their new GPS system report for February 2013. The new report consists of the following information (in columns from left to right):

1. Name of the patrolling officer;
2. A unique PHS internal activity number;
3. The call type;
4. The call address;
5. The longitude/latitude/date/time of the activity;
6. The date and time the officer arrived on site;
7. The date and time the officer left the site;
8. The time taken to get to the site after the call is dispatched to the officer;
9. The result of the call;
10. The total time taken on the call from arrival to departure.

Once PHS's new GPS system is fully functional, the City will have an additional and more effective auditing mechanism to ensure PHS is providing the services required by the contract. If the system is not operational by the time committed by Chameleon, other options will be discussed for implementation including random physical audits to verify the information provided, temporary installation of the City's GPS functionality until a permanent functional system is available or can be acquired, or a complete operational audit performed by a third party to provide recommendations to ensure the City is receiving services per the contract.







## NONPROFIT RESOURCE CENTER OPENS AT LA PINTORESCA BRANCH LIBRARY

### Flintridge Center Donates Research Collection to Benefit Nonprofits and Local Community

Pasadena Public Library and Flintridge Center are pleased to announce the opening of the new Nonprofit Resource Center at La Pintaresca Branch Library. This special collection was created by Flintridge in 1993 and maintained at its offices through 2012 as a free resource library to support the work of local nonprofit organizations. The collection was ranked as one of the most significant collections for nonprofits in the Western United States. The holdings include extensive reference and circulating materials on fundraising and nonprofit management. Flintridge Center has donated the special collection to the Pasadena Public Library with the intent to focus exclusively on providing critical services to reduce community violence and programs for at-risk youth.

"The collection's new home in Flintridge's service area of Northwest Pasadena/West Altadena is an ideal fit," said Flintridge Center President Jaylene Moseley. "Now these valuable resources will be more accessible to nonprofits and our community, since La Pintaresca is open six days a week. Donating them to the library frees us to concentrate on pressing community needs."

The Nonprofit Resource Center is located in a dedicated space at the La Pintaresca branch and will operate as a Cooperating Collection of the Foundation Center, the country's largest repository of fundraising and nonprofit development resources. It is the only Cooperating Collection serving the San Gabriel Valley and is expected to be widely used by nonprofit staff and volunteers throughout greater Los Angeles.

"We are delighted to receive this wonderful collection and to be able to continue the Flintridge Center's work in providing local nonprofits with the resources they need to make a difference in our community," said Pasadena Public Library Director Jan Sanders.

The Nonprofit Resource Center is equipped with a dedicated computer with access to the Foundation Directory Online database. This computer is available on a first-come, first-served basis, Monday through Thursday, from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., and on Friday and Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Two additional computers, located in the branch's Technology Learning Lab, also provide access to the grants research database during the Lab's designated hours for adults. La Pintaresca staff is available onsite to assist users with the database.






