### WEEKLY NEWSLETTER

1. **Community Invited to August 13 Event on Non-Potable/Recycled Water Project:**

Pasadena Water and Power (“PWP”) is hosting a community meeting about the Non-Potable Water Project (also known as the Recycled Water Project). The event will be held on Thursday, August 13, 2015 from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at Brookside Golf Club, Arroyo Room, 1133 Rosemont Ave. in Pasadena. Residents and businesses are encouraged to attend to share their thoughts on the project. An event flyer is attached which provides detailed information.

The proposed Project involves constructing a new pipeline to deliver recycled water from the Los Angeles-Glendale Water Reclamation Plant to bring more than 3,000 acre feet annually to Pasadena for commercial landscape irrigation, dust control, and industrial cooling. This comes at a critical time as Pasadena is exploring opportunities to invest in long-term solutions to enhance local water supplies.



2. **Pasadena Water Conservation Progress: June 1- July 29:**

The weekly Pasadena Water Savings Gauge showed an increase in conservation from 24% to 25%. This week’s gauge is based on cumulative data from June 1 through July 29, 2015.

Hotter outdoor temperatures are predicted into August so continue to do your part to conserve. The water savings percentage will fluctuate from week-to-week based on whether outdoor temperatures are hot or cool.

The Parks & Natural Resources Division has posted the non-emergency removals and notified pertinent residents consistent with the City's Tree Removal Policy.
